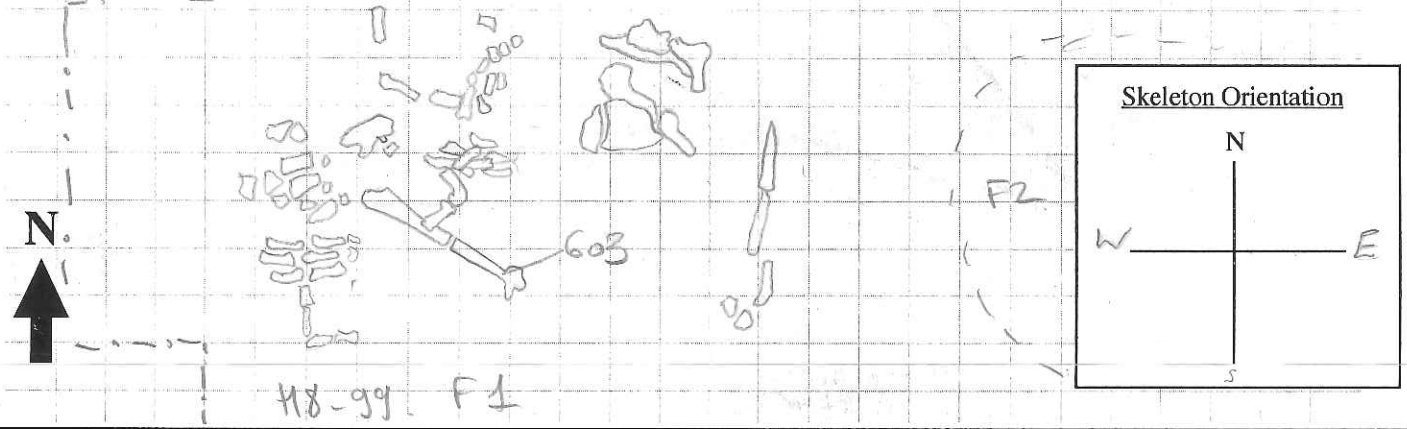

The position of the bones testify of a primary burial probably in a pit which the limits couldn't be seen on the upper level of the preserved fill.

The preservation and representation of the skeletal don't allow to assert on the presence of a wrapping or other funerary element.

We can say that the bottom of the pit is quite irregular.

Measurements: 1) Right humerus (outer condylus to upper end): 27,5 cm  
 2) hip bone (anterior side to posterior inferior iliac spine): 12,7 cm  
 3) Fibula (part of diaphysis): 19,5 cm  
 4) (otlopubic width): 2,4 cm  
 5) Aretabulum height: 3,5 cm
