

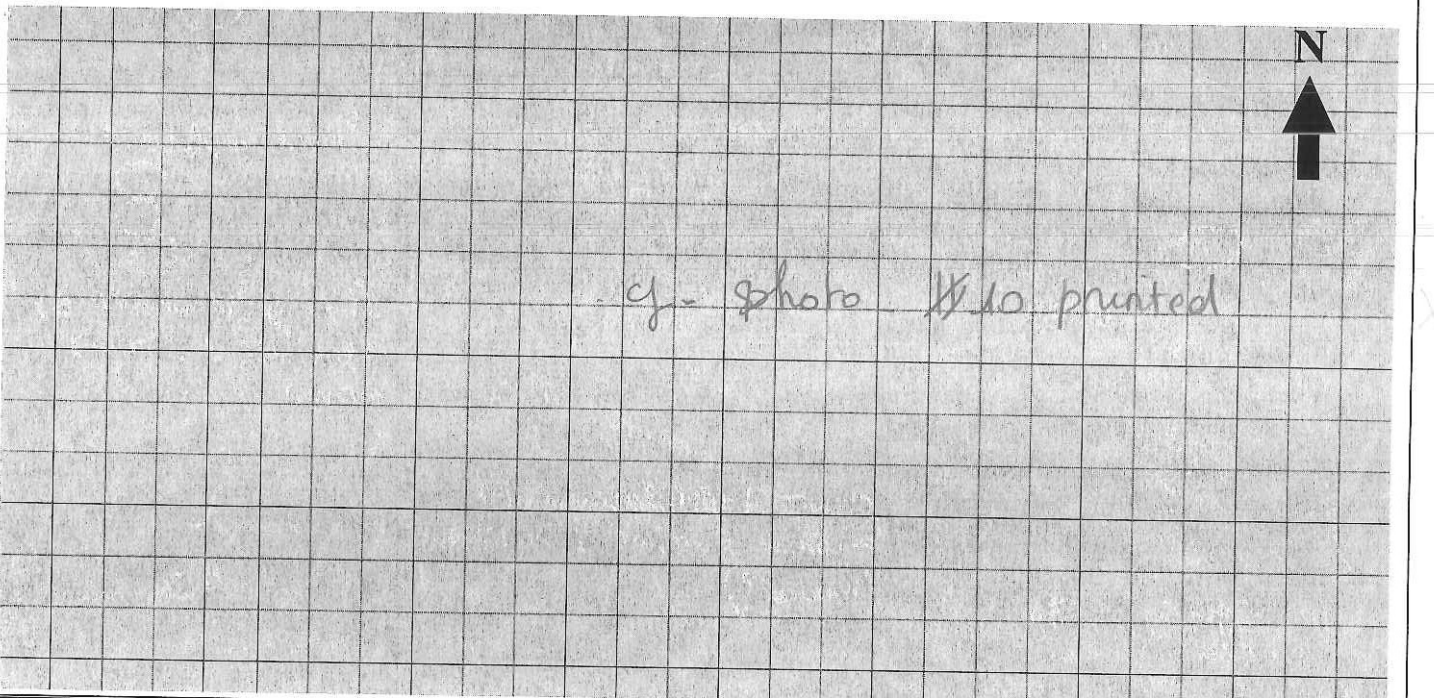

 In the middle a specific stone (626) has been recorded apart because it could have been a capping stone.
 The stones used for cover are in majority angular of $\approx 20\text{cm L}$, 20 cm width and 8-10 cm depth. Packed in a small cairn there was soil between the stones (629)

 On the stones and the fill were found the deposits 608, 617, and probably 621.

BURIAL COVER OF BURIAL OF SKULL 623

This cover is made of stones and a few number of large pieces of CBM, carefully placed on the burial. It has been slightly damaged by the digger and ploughing but the general layout could be clearly identified. On the top the pile of stones covered all the pit, we could distinguish an inner row of stone (614) and an outer row of stones (618) lining the limit of the cut especially on the South, West and northern side. No clear angle of the stones has been observed, but in the middle it seems that the stones collapsed into the pit causing damages on the bones, especially from the middle of the body (right elbow) to the lower limb.
