623, the burial fill (619) where elements of the cover 614, 629, 618, 626 have been fallen into.

Shallow pit irregular with a gentle slope SW to NE. The Western Northern sides are more straight than the SW and the NE sides.

Text The cut [607] correspond to the pit of the burial F2. Cut into 605 (ditch?) it is filled with 635 (organic material?) Sk. 623, the burial fill (619) where elements of the cover 614, 629, 618, 626 have been fallen into. In plan, it has an oval shape of 1,80 m length and 1,35 m width.

Shallow with stepped sides on the West and east, more straight on the SW and north, the bottom draw a gentle slope SW-NE.

Its irregularity is due to bioturbation, especially animal burrow and probably the layer where the pit has been dug associated with a fill of mixed material (soil, CBH, pottery, limestone inclusions).
